This serial number often provides information about the date and place of manufacture. The Gun Control Act 1968 stipulates that all firearms must bear a serial number from the manufacturer, and that this serial number cannot be obscured or removed. Serial locations will vary between models and manufacturers, but the numbers are often found on the bottom of the butt or on the inside of the frame. Manufacturers sometimes allow owners to look up the date of a gun manufacture by entering the serial number in a website tool. A serial number is a unique, identifying number or group of numbers and letters assigned to a single piece of hardware or software. Other things have serial numbers as well, however, including banknotes and other similar documents. The idea behind serial numbers is to identify a specific object, much like how a fingerprint identifies a specific person. Instead of certain names or numbers indicating an entire assortment of products, a serial number is intended to give a unique number to one unit at a time. In other words, a serial number used for software is attached to the buyer, not that specific copy of the program. The term serial number is often shortened to s/n or sn, especially when the word precedes an actual serial number on something. Serial numbers are also sometimes, but not often, called serial codes. It is important to distinguish serial numbers from other identification codes or numbers. In short, serial numbers are unique. For example, a model number for a router might be EA2700 but that's true for each individual Linksys EA2700 router; the model numbers are identical, while each serial number is unique for each component. As an example, if Linksys sold 100 EA2700 routers in one day from their website, each of these devices would have EA2700 somewhere on them and they would look identical to the naked eye. But each unit, when it was built, had serial numbers printed on most of the components that are not the same as the others bought that day (or any day). UPC Codes are common as well but are not actually unique as serial numbers. UPC codes are different than serial numbers because UPC codes are not unique to each individual piece of hardware or software, as serial numbers are. The ISSN used for magazines and ISBN for books is different as well because they are used for whole queries or magazines and are not unique to each instance of the copy. I'm sure you've seen serial numbers many times before. Almost every part of your computer has a serial number including your monitor, keyboard, mouse, and your entire computer system as a whole. Internal computer components such as hard drives, optical drives, and motherboards also have serial numbers. Serial numbers are used by hardware manufacturers to track individual items, usually for quality control. For example, if a hardware is recalled for some reason, customers are usually made aware of which specific devices need service by being provided with a series of serial numbers. Serial numbers are also used in non-technical environments such as when you keep an inventory of tools borrowed in a lab or workshop floor. It is easy to identify which devices need to be returned or which have been misplaced because each of them can be identified by their unique serial number. Software serial numbers are typically used to help ensure that the program's installation is performed only once and only on the purchaser's computer. When the serial number is used and registered with the manufacturer, any future attempt to use the same serial number can raise a red flag because no two serial numbers (from the same software) are the same. If you plan to reinstall a program that you purchased, you sometimes need the serial number to do so. See our guide on how to find a serial key if you need to reinstall some software. Sometimes you may find that a software program may try to make a serial number for you that you can use to activate a program illegally (because the code was not purchased legally). These programs are called keygens (key generator) and should be avoided. A serial number for a piece of software is usually not the same as a product key, but they are sometimes used interchangeably. In most Washburn guitars, the first two digits of the serial number indicate the year of production. Washburn has utilized a variety of serial format throughout its history. Guitars with serial numbers containing five or more characters were produced from the 1980s to the 2000s. Guitars with serial numbers containing five or lesser characters were probably produced in the 1980s, and four-character serial numbers indicate that a guitar was produced in the 1970s or early 1980s. Washburn guitars manufactured before the 1970s have no serial number. Vehicles manufactured after 1969 will all the serial number on the driver's side dashboard, which can be seen through the windshield.
